

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR-IN-CHARGE

TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD

O "Transforming Lives, Changing the World". And while some may think that "Transforming Lives" is a call for us to transform others' lives, it's actually a reminder for us to have our lives transformed by God. It makes sense, doesn't it? Only transformed lives can change the world — can't have it any other way.

Where then does the Word of God come in? The Word of God is an "agent" or "tool" of that transformation.

Colossians 1:6 states that "This same Good News that came to you is going out all over the world. It is bearing fruit everywhere by changing lives, just as it changed your lives from the day you first heard and understood the truth about God's wonderful grace." (NLT)

The Good News or Gospel has the power to change and transform our lives. And this shouldn't surprise us. Jesus Himself prayed to the Father for His followers in John 17:17, that God will "Make them holy by your truth; teach them your word, which is truth."(NLT)

Hence if we're serious about being transformed and changed by God, we can't ignore the Word of God. It makes us holy and it changes us.

It is therefore our prayer and hope that this tool, Transformed by the Word may spark an exciting transformational journey for all of us as we journey through God's living Word together.

And as we do just that, may we learn from scripture what is true, realise what is wrong in our lives, be corrected when we are wrong and be taught to do what is right. And we pray that God uses it to prepare and equip us his people to do every good work. (Paraphrased from 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NLT)

Let's be transformed!

Reverend Reuben Ng Pastor-in-Charge **'Transformed by the Word'** is not just another Bible reading plan or routine.

In John 1:1-4, 14, we read that the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word existed from the beginning of time even prior to creation. This Word became human and lived among people. He possessed a glory that can only be describwed as the glory of God. This Word that became human is Jesus Christ our Lord.

'Transformed by the Word' is a tool that aims to facilitate a transformative encounter with the Living Word made flesh in Jesus.

The word *"transformed"* comes from the Greek word metamorphoo. It literally means "to change into another form". The process of a caterpillar morphing into a butterfly is a wonderful illustration of such a radical transformation. Romans 12:2 teaches us that the renewal of our minds is the key for a transformed life. The fruit of our transformation is that we reflect the glory of God (2 Cor 3:18).

'Transformed by the Word' facilitates the renewal our minds through God's Word. As we meet God daily in His Word, we catch a glimpse of the glory of God and His heartbeat. As we contemplate God's teachings and choose to apply what we learn in our lives, the Holy Spirit produces in us the fruit of transformation that reflects His glory. What an exciting prospect!

Let us begin this journey together as a church family with an expectant heart that God will accomplish in us His work of transformation through the daily encounter of His Word.

HOW TO USE 'TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD'

The readings are arranged in chronological order of the Bible, with Psalms and Proverbs weaved inbetween to provide variety in our daily engagement with the Word. Reading in chronological order helps us grasp the big picture of God's salvation plan better.

Place and Time

Designate a regular time daily in an environment conducive to read the Bible and commune with God with minimal distraction.

Come Before God

Breathe deep and be silent. Take your time to let God quiet your mind and heart.

Begin to pray and remember you are here to encounter the Word, and to discover yourself.

The Bible

Read the Bible text slowly a few times. Take note of verses, phrases and words or big ideas that are speaking to you.

The Daily Questions

There are usually one to three questions. Listen to what God is asking you through these questions. **Note:** These are not comprehension questions. They are designed to direct us into a deeper discovery of God, ourselves, and our relationships with Him and others. They will challenge us to apply God's truth into our lives with the help of the Holy Spirit.

If one of the questions is challenging you to go deeper, obey the Holy Spirit and see what He is revealing to you. The key is not in answering all the questions but in applying the Word into your life.

Other generic questions that may help you to apply the Word into your life:

- 1. From the passage, what aspect of your life is God revealing that requires transformation?
- 2. What is one thing that God is challenging you to do in your relationship with Him and with others?
- 3. Is there a command to obey, a sin to confess or avoid, a promise to claim, an example to follow, a truth to rejoice in, any thanksgiving to be given?



End with a prayer

Continue in a posture of silence and wait as God reveals more things or confirms your prayers. Respond to God in prayer.

Periodical Review

It is extremely beneficial to review periodically how God has transformed you and give thanks to Him. A journal is a useful tool to review your journey and growth.

Journal

Buy a good journal to record your reflections and prayers! Write or even draw what God has revealed or called you to do. Journaling is an important and useful private discipline that will help us to remember the discoveries about God, ourselves, and the applications that God is calling us to. You may also choose to journal electronically. There are many useful journaling apps that can be found in the AppStore (iOS) and the Google Play Store (Android).

Find a buddy

We are never alone in our journey of faith! Find someone to journey with you - they could be your fellow Life Group member, a family member, a close friend, or even a colleague. Share how God's Word is speaking to or transforming you, to spur and encourage each other as you continue on this journey. Hold each other accountable in the reading and application of God's Word. And remember to celebrate how God is working in both your lives! Communion with God brings much joy into our life that is worth celebrating!

Missed Readings

Missed a day or two? Don't panic. Reading the Bible is not a legalistic practice. Just read the day's designated readings and catch up on what you missed when you are able to.

Enjoy!!

Finally, enjoy your time with the Word. Like the psalmist said in Psalm 119:103 "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" May you have a daily sweet communion with God!

DAILY DEVOTION GUIDE JULY 2024 PASSAGE & QUESTION



John 9:1-41

- 1. What might stop us from seeing the amazing things God does? How can we fix these wrong ideas?
- Jesus did the work of God when He saw it. What work is God prompting you to do today or this week? Act upon it.



John 10:1-21

- 1. How well do you recognise God's voice? How can you get better at recognising it?
- 2. Who among your friends or family isn't following Jesus? In light of this year's theme to *Make Disciples Intentionally*, how can you reach out to them and show them how to walk with Jesus in their lives? Choose one or two people and start praying for them.



Luke 10

- 1. Why did Jesus tell the 72 not to carry money or greet anyone on the road? How does this remind us to focus on being dedicated followers of Christ?
- 2. Who are the people around you that you consider your neighbours? What can you do to show God's love to them?



Luke 11

- 1. Imagine how things would change if God's kingdom was present in your home, school, or workplace. How can you help bring God's kingdom into these places?
- 2. What does it mean to be "full of light"? What is one thing you can do so that others notice the light in you today?

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John 10:22-42

- Jesus declares that He and the Father are one—He is the one true God. What stops you from believing in and following Him completely?
- 2. How do you react to the good works or miracles Jesus has done in your life? How did they transform you? Write a short testimony about this.



Luke 12:1-34

- Whom should we fear and whom should we not worry about? How does knowing this shape how you relate to God and live your life?
- 2. It is natural to invest time into building our worldly treasures. What are some ways you can invest your time so that you are rich towards God?



Luke 12:35-59

- 1. How can you prepare yourself for Jesus' second coming?
- 2. How can you be a good steward of all that God has given you?



Luke 13

1. What do you need to repent from?

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2. For whom can you pray, that God may give them time to repent and turn to Him? Say a prayer for them now.



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Luke 14:1-24

- 1. What are some ways you exalt yourself?
- 2. How can you practice humility?



Luke 14:25-34

- In what area of your life do you need to pray "not my will, but God's will be done"?
- 2. What are some things you treasure more than God?



Luke 15

- 1. What can you learn about God's forgiveness from the portrayal of the father in the parable?
- 2. Think of someone who has fallen out of church and drop them a message to find out how they are doing. If possible, invite them to come back for a Sunday service or join your Life Group fellowship session.



Luke 16:1-18

- 1. In what ways do you serve money?
- 2. How will you use your money for the advancement of Christ's kingdom?

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Luke 16:19-31

- 1. Think about the blessings (especially wealth) you have. How will you use them practically, not just in thoughts or feelings, but in actions?
- 2. When you receive God's word, do you pay attention to it, even if it comes from someone unexpected? How can you be more open to hearing what God wants to tell you, especially when that message is challenging to accept?



Luke 17:1-10

- 1. Have you been hurt badly by someone or done something wrong to someone and can't let it go? What does Jesus want you to do as His follower, and why is it important?
- 2. Think back on God's faithfulness in your life through the years. How can you respond in faith with the attitude of a servant?



John 11:1-44

- 1. How has knowing about Jesus' resurrection power helped ease your worries and made your faith in Him stronger?
- 2. Have you ever had to wait a long time for an answer to your prayers? What did you learn about God and yourself during that time? Write a short testimony and share it with your Life Group, friend or relative.



John 11:45-55

- 1. In verses 49-50, Caiaphas, the high priest, said it's better for one person to die for the people than for the whole nation to be destroyed. What do you think he meant? Thinking about John 3:16, what does this teach you about God and what does it mean to you?
- 2. The Pharisees couldn't deny Jesus' miracles but still rejected Him because they cared more about themselves and their power. Are there parts of your life you're scared to let God change? How will you ask God for help so He can be Lord and truly in charge of your life?



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Luke 17:11-37

- 1. The ten lepers asked for healing and only one returned to praise Jesus. To be like the one leper, how can you remind yourself to be grateful and always praise Him? What are three things you can be grateful for and give thanks to God for now?
- 2. What did Jesus say about His return and when? Given that, how will you live your life now until His return?



Luke 18:1-17

- What did Jesus say about our prayers in today's reading? How can we apply them in our prayers?
- 2. What is it about little children that enables them to receive the Kingdom of God better than an adult? How can we apply that to ourselves so that every child and/or young believer can see Jesus in us?



Matthew 19:1-15; Mark 10:1-16

- 1. How is society's idea of marriage different from the Christian view? How can you ensure your heart is not hardened to God's standard for marriage?
- 2. Jesus wants us to serve Him and love our spouse fully. How will your marriage be if you did this all the time? If you're single, how can you prioritise serving God and loving others in your life?



Matthew 19:16-28; Mark 10:17-31

- 1. What parts of your life are God asking you to let go of so you can follow Him? How will you start doing that?
- 2. What can you do to show love to someone today? Do it now.

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Mark 10:32-52

- 1. Even though Jesus knew he would suffer in Jerusalem, he still went. How can you stay strong when you know tough times are coming?
- 2. Jesus showed mercy to Bartimaeus despite his troubles. How can you be kind to the marginalised in society, even when you're busy?



Matthew 20:1-19

- 1. How can you respond when God calls you to labour harder than other Christians?
- 2. God's system of ranking may be different from the world (v16). What are some examples of being first in the world and last in the kingdom of God? What does the opposite look like and how can we seek to apply this in our lives?



Matthew 20:20-34

- 1. How can you exercise greater servant leadership in church or your workplace?
- 2. The blind men cried out all the more when others rebuked them (v31). How can you persevere in prayer in the face of opposition?



Matthew 21:1-27

- 1. Think of some practices in your life that are not aligned with God's word. How can you stop doing them?
- 2. Have we turned the church building into something other than a place for worshipping God? What can you do to make the church a place of worship again?



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Matthew 21:28-46

- 1. How are you fulfilling God's will in your own life? What are you doing that is already according to His will, and what else can you do?
- 2. What are the fruits of the kingdom (v43) and how can you produce them?





Luke 18:18-34

- 1. Are there any material possessions that you cannot bear to part with? How do these things prevent you from serving God and what can you do about it?
- 2. Are you prepared to go to another country or give up a comfortable lifestyle with your loved ones to further God's kingdom? Why or why not? Consider sharing/discussing this with a mentor.



Luke 19:35-48

The disciples showed honour to Jesus by praising Him loudly and spreading their cloaks on the road. What can you do to show honour to Jesus in your life?



Mark 11:1-11

1. Jesus went into Jerusalem in triumph. What are some things Jesus has helped you triumph over in your life?

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2. How can you give Jesus the welcome He deserves in worship?

John 12:1-19

- 1. How can you put aside greed and be generous with the Lord?
- 2. Scripture declares that Jesus is the long-awaited King. How can you acknowledge Jesus' kingship over your life?

- History tells us that the moneychangers and merchants exploited visitors to the temple. How do people take advantage of others today? How can you help those who have been taken advantage of?
- 2. Think of someone you need to forgive. Ask God to forgive you of your sin and ask for His help to forgive the person.



John 12:20-36

- 1. In this world of darkness, what kinds of lights are there beckoning us to follow?
- 2. How can we ensure that we have the right kind of light?

AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION



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John 12:37-50

- 1. What is God's commandment? What makes God's commandment lead to eternal life?
- 2. Think about times you followed what God wanted instead of what you wanted. How can you keep doing what God wants instead of what you want?



Matthew 22:1-22

- 1. For many are called, but few are chosen. What have you been called to do? How can you prepare for it so that you become one of the chosen?
- 2. The coin bore Caesar's image. Similarly, having been made in God's image, we bear the image of God. Knowing this, how can you offer yourself to God?



Mark 12:1-17

- 1. Like the farmers, we sometimes shoot the messenger bringing God's word because we do not like the message. Who are God's messengers and what attitude should we adopt towards them?
- 2. What are some things God has commanded us to give, but you choose to hold back from Him? Pray and ask God to help you surrender these things to Him.



Matthew 22:23-46

- 1. How does Jesus' answer to the Sadducees about their disbelief of resurrection help you to share about Jesus with your unbeliever friends/ families/colleagues?
- 2. How can you demonstrate to others the greatest commandments that Jesus taught us, which is "to love God and our neighbours"?



AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION





Mark 12:18-34

- 1. What does it mean to you and others that we worship a living God—a God who's alive and active?
- 2. How can you help bring God's kingdom to the people you know?



Mark 12:35-44

- 1. Who do you say Jesus is?
- 2. How does knowing who Jesus is impact your witnessing?



Luke 20:1-26

- 1. Do you sometimes forget God's authority and take His grace for granted? Ask God to forgive you for the times you have rebelled against Him and pray that He will help you to follow in His ways.
- 2. What is one attitude you can work on this week to be a better bearer of God's image? Write it down and place it somewhere visible as a reminder to practise this attitude.



Matthew 23:1-12

- 1. What is Jesus' definition of hypocrisy?
- 2. How can you apply Jesus' teaching on hypocrisy in your life?





AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION



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Matthew 23:13-39

- 1. List the seven woes of the teachers of the Law and the Pharisees. Ask God to forgive your sins and the sins of others.
- 2. Pray for the Church in Singapore, that we may seek God for repentance and avoid sin. That we may be true worshippers of God, seeking justice, mercy and faithfulness.



Luke 20:27-47

- 1. How does the promise of the resurrection give you hope?
- 2. How might you be making prayer and worship services to God a show to impress others? How can you adopt an attitude of humility instead?



Luke 21:1-4

- 1. The rich gave some, but the widow gave everything. How do you feel when you give things, time, or energy to serve God?
- 2. What does it mean to give all you have to God, and how can you handle the sacrifices and discomfort that come with it?



Luke 21:5-28

We are called to bear witness to others, even amid persecution. Considering this year's theme to *Make Disciples Intentionally*, tell someone one thing about Jesus that you find beautiful and gives you hope to keep going in your faith.



AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION





Luke 21:29-38

- 1. What are your distractions/vices and how do you keep vigilant over the condition of your own heart?
- 2. Encourage someone who is struggling to "stay awake" and is having a tough time, or has lost hope.



Mark 13:1-31

- 1. Satan, the enemy, comes to steal, kill and destroy. Think of a time of suffering and trial. How did God rescue you? Write a short testimony about it and share this with one person.
- 2. How can you stand firm to the end? Break it down into "stand", "firm" and how you hope to "end".



Matthew 24:1-35

- 1. When God decides to show Himself, He is undeniable and uncontainable. How are you ignoring or rejecting Him and His power?
- 2. God's word remains true forever, even beyond heaven and earth. How does this encourage you?



Mark 13:32-37

- 1. No one knows when Christ will return. How will you remain faithful to God and the tasks He assigned you?
- 2. It is difficult to keep constant watch—how will you mutually encourage someone to stay faithful to God?



AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION



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Matthew 24:36-51

- 1. Consider the consequences of neglecting your responsibilities and failing to live according to God's expectations. How can you cultivate a greater sense of accountability and diligence in your spiritual journey?
- 2. Think about the importance of being prepared for unexpected events and the return of Jesus. How can you live each day with a sense of readiness and anticipation for His coming?



Matthew 25:1-30

- 1. How should we live our lives until Jesus comes back?
- 2. Do you sometimes underestimate your abilities? How can you use your abilities to make full use of the blessings God has given you?



Matthew 25:31-46

- 1. How can you know if you're doing well spiritually and helping those in need because you love Jesus? Who can you help because they need it?
- 2. While waiting for Jesus to come back, how should you treat others? How might your actions separate you from the pretenders and unbelievers?



Matthew 26:1-16

- 1. Consider the actions of the woman who anointed Jesus with expensive perfume. What does her act of devotion teach us about sacrificial love and the value of honouring Jesus with our possessions?
- 2. Think about Judas' betrayal of Jesus for money. What can we learn from Judas' actions about the dangers of greed and the consequences of prioritizing material gain over loyalty to God?



AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION





Mark 14:1-10

- 1. How much do you love and care about Jesus?
- 2. How do you treat Jesus? Like the scribes and priests, the woman, or like Judas? What do you need to do to be like the woman?



Luke 22:1-6

- 1. What did the Pharisees fear about the people? How can you ensure your fear of man does not become greater than your fear of God?
- 2. Consider the role of the religious leaders in conspiring to arrest Jesus. How does their manipulation of the situation highlight the dangers of pride, self-righteousness, and hypocrisy?



Matthew 26:17-35

- 1. Reflect on Jesus' words to His disciples about His impending suffering and death. How does Jesus' willingness to endure suffering for the sake of others challenge us to reevaluate our attitudes towards sacrifice and service?
- 2. What can we do to resist satisfying our desires?



Mark 14:11-31

- 1. Every month, we partake of the Lord's Supper. Remembering what Jesus has done for you and anticipating His return, how would that change your approach in preparing and partaking of the Lord's Supper?
- 2. Imagine you were Peter. How would you feel and what would you do after Jesus' words to you? Why? What can we learn from Peter saying he'd always be there for Jesus, but then not doing it?



AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & OUESTION



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Matthew 26:36-68

- 1. What is the first thing you do when you are stressed? How can you develop a habit of turning to God in prayer whenever you are stressed?
- 2. Jesus told His disciple, Peter, to hold back from violence when he was being arrested (v52). How can you hold yourself back from taking things into your own hands when things are not going as you wish?



Mark 14:32-65

- 1. Jesus surrendered to God's will in His prayer by saying "Yet not what I will, but what you will." How can you surrender to God's will in your prayers?
- 2. When Jesus finally answered the high priest truthfully, they condemned Him to death and struck Him. How can you share an uncomfortable truth, such as the reality of sin and hell, courageously with others when others would treat you harshly?



Matthew 26:69-74

Peter was scared to say he was with Jesus. How have you been afraid to admit that you are a Christian? What are some things you can do to show others that you are a Christian? How can you share an uncomfortable truth, such as the reality of sin and hell, courageously with others when others treat you harshly?



Mark 14:66-72

- 1. How should we respond if we have denied Jesus before others?
- 2. Peter cursed himself while denying Jesus. Have there been times when you denied letting Jesus into your life? How can you invite Jesus into various parts of your life so that you live it abundantly?

AUGUST 2024 PASSAGE & QUESTION



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Luke 22:7-38

- 1. Jesus helped His disciples find a donkey before, and now He tells them where to prepare for the Passover. How can these stories of God planning things ahead make you believe in Him more?
- 2. What does it mean to take the Lord's Supper in remembrance of Jesus?

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Luke 22:39-71

- 1. Jesus showed kindness to the high priest's servant by healing the servant's ear when He was arrested. How can you be kind and loving to people who aren't nice to you?
- 2. Although He was innocent, Jesus took the cup of suffering and allowed Himself to be arrested. When you are going through suffering, how can you remind yourself that God is still sovereign?



John 13:1-17

- 1. Jesus went to great lengths to serve his disciples by performing an extremely lowly task of washing their feet. What are some lowly tasks in serving others that the world would avoid but we as Christians should not avoid?
- 2. Jesus also washed the feet of Judas, who would eventually betray him. Think of how you can maintain an attitude of humility with those who seek to harm you.
